Julia has worked on an oral history project interviewing pioneers of the San Fernando Valley including children who grew up in Sunland-Tujunga to pioneer families 1900-1920.

Excerpt from Julia's poem, AFTER THE FIRE STORM -

"We walked up to the stone ruins of the stagecoach house, saw blackened weeds in the middle of stone cisterns, started hiking up the brown-stone devil's slide where once a stagecoach route cut across the hills; now we can learn to find the path through the stony land.

We saw against the black ash a green weed with stinking yellow lemon gourds--the calabash. Yes, we need to be green weeds and lemon gourds stinking up the blackness of this city, saying we can grow again, making this city a good green place."
