# Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council **Request for Funding**

The Little Landers Historical Society requests assistance in funding our major event for 2017: **The Cemetery Tour** to take place on Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

#### Amount of request: \$3,275

Rental of shuttle busses to transport guests - \$2,500 Breakfast for volunteers the day of dress rehearsal, October 7th - \$150 Lunch for volunteers the day of the tour, October 14<sup>th</sup> - \$200 Bottled water for volunteers and guests the day of tour - \$50 Rental of two portable restrooms and a hand washing station - \$375

Note: Several years ago, Herrold Egger took on the task of maintaining the cemetery. If it weren't for all the work he has done, and continues to do, we would not be able to have this event.

The STNC will be noted as a sponsor. We will show your logo on all promotional materials and mention your name wherever the event is listed. We anticipate this to be on the following: flyers, banners, posters, Facebook, LLHS web-site, newspaper ads, refreshment table at the cemetery, signs on the busses, signs on the portable restrooms. The STNC would need to provide a jpeg or gif of the logo and any appropriate wording you would like us to use.

The entire community (and beyond) is invited. We have already begun to promote this event and more intense promotion will begin in September and October. Advertisements will be placed in the local papers (Foothill Record, CV Weekly, Tolucan Times), Leonis Adobe places our events in their electronic newsletter, and we do press releases to over 25 papers and organizations.

We want to accommodate 50 to 60 guests per tour. The actual number will be determined on the size and number of shuttle busses. Tickets are \$20 per person.

We will have 5 tour times and guests may choose whichever tour they want: 8:30 and 10:15 AM, 12:00, 1:45 and 3:30 PM. Each tour will last approximately 90 minutes.

Guests are **not** permitted to drive their own cars to the cemetery; they must ride the shuttle busses. There is only enough parking at the cemetery for a few cars (those of the volunteers arriving early for set-up). We must use small busses that are shorter in length and able to negotiate one lane roads and the hairpin turn. The shuttle busses will be used for ten hours. We will reserve the space in front of Bolton Hall Museum for exclusive use of the shuttles busses. We will apply for a city permit one month in advance of the tour to reserve the space in front of the museum.

Tickets for the public will become available on September 15th. Tickets must be purchased in advance; there will be no sales the day of event. Tickets can be purchased three ways:

- 1) On our web-site using a charge card or PayPal;
- 2) Coming to BHM to complete a simple order form and paying with cash or check; or,
- 3) Printing the order form from the web-site and mailing to LLHS with a check.

E-mail notices will be sent to each purchaser the week of October 9<sup>th</sup> to confirm their ticket order and give further instructions on parking, wearing proper clothing and to be on time (*each tour will start on time!*).

Refreshments will be purchased through local restaurants and stores.

The quote for rental of portable restrooms is through Andy Gump.

The quote for shuttle busses is through US Coachways.

We are willing to use other vendors – those authorized by the City of Los Angeles or those who already have a good relationship with the STNC.

LLHS already has liability coverage, but we will purchase additional coverage for this one day event if so required.

#### Description of the Cemetery tour:

Guests may use the Elks Lodge parking lot. Upon arrival at BHM, guests check-in at the Commerce Avenue door and are given a color-coded ticket. There will be a short presentation on the history of the cemetery. Guests then board the shuttle busses to the cemetery. Upon arrival at the cemetery, guests are greeted by Herrold who will give them instructions. They then divide into their four color-coded groups. Two Police Cadets are assigned to each group and will guide their group to the appropriate starting point and to each skit location. There will be six skits depicting interesting Sunland-Tujunga residents, many buried at the cemetery. Once each group has seen each skit, guests will have 15 to 20 minutes to explore the cemetery. A bell will ring and the guests will board the busses for the ride back to BHM. This is repeated five times during the course of the day.

#### August 2 2017

#### Members of the STNC:

There is a conflict of use problem in the Angeles National Forest: Hiker, Biker, Equestrian vs. Hunter. This effects the safety and quality of life of our families and their animals in Sunland-Tujunga. Specifically, the Haines Canyon Debris Basin and the area north of the Riverwood Ranch - stretching west to Little Tujunga Canyon are in question.

As the city becomes more populated and pushes against US Forest Service boundaries, more people are using the National Forest for recreation. Hiking and biking have become more popular than ever, and equestrians continue to ride the dedicated horse trails.

The problem comes during 2 months in the fall, when hunters are allowed to pursue deer with high powered rifles and bow and arrows. For many years this was an accepted practice. In the past, one or two hunters a year would "hoof-it-in" to try to find a deer. But last year brought a relatively large population of hunters, not on foot, but in pick-up trucks and ATVs. Several incidents were documented where an equestrian or hiker was occupying the same part of a trail as a person shooting at a deer, or a coyote. This influx of hunters made community members stop and wonder if it is even legal for deer hunting to take place in high density recreation areas.

According to the Los Angeles County Firearms Closure Areas map, it is already illegal to shoot guns in most of those areas. Furthermore, the San Gabriel/Verdugo Mountain Scenic Preservation map declares most of these areas to be within the Los Angeles City Boundary. There is absolutely no firearm or bow and arrow discharge allowed in Los Angeles unless on a licensed shooting or archery range. In the Riverwood Ranch area, there are US Forest Service signs forbidding guns.

While we respect the rights of hunters, we assert there is no place for the hunt in high density recreation areas. This is a deadly accident waiting to happen. There are hundreds of square miles of the Angeles National Forest where hunting is appropriate. It does not belong next to homes nor on the hiking, biking and equestrian trails of Sunland-Tujunga. We must make it safe for our families and animals who live next these areas, and also allow everyone to enjoy the Angeles National Forest without fear.

We are asking the City of Los Angeles to immediately work with other agencies, and community members, to declare these areas closed to firearms and bow and arrow discharge before the hunting season of 2017 begins, and to work with all agencies to ensure the 'no firearms or bow and arrow discharge laws' are enforced this year and every year going forward.

# Re: Support for Establishment of 2,500-foot Health and Safety Setback Around Oil and Gas Extraction in Los Angeles

Dear Council President Wesson and Los Angeles City Council:

We respectfully express our support for an ordinance to establish a 2,500-foot setback separating oil and gas extraction operations from sensitive land uses such as homes, schools, and hospitals. We would also like to express gratitude to the City Council for the motion passed on June 30, 2017 (Council File # 17-0447) directing the City Attorney, Petroleum Administrator, and Department of Planning to perform a legal, land use, health, environmental, and economic study of such an ordinance. We applaud Council President Wesson for introducing this motion and Councilmembers Bonin, Cedillo, Harris-Dawson, Koretz, and Martinez for co-sponsoring the motion.

Los Angeles contains the largest and most densely populated urban oil field in the nation. There are over 1,000 active oil wells in the City of Los Angeles, and 80 percent of these wells are located within 2,500 feet of a sensitive land use such as a home, school, hospital, or church. Oil and gas extraction sites routinely use and emit toxic chemicals, and these emissions are at their highest and most dangerous concentration at the source of pollution. Additionally, more than half of the active wells are located in low-income Latino and African-American neighborhoods, such as Wilmington and South L.A., which are already overburdened by environmental hazards. Residents from these neighborhoods have documented serious health problems—including nosebleeds, chronic migraines, nausea, asthma, and other respiratory illness—in addition to daily disruption from drilling noise and vibrations, foul odors, and diesel truck traffic.

There is precedent for a health and safety buffer around drilling sites in Los Angeles. The City amended its zoning code in the 1940's, with an express declaration that "oil drilling and production in urbanized areas is detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare." Classifying these operations as non-conforming uses—meaning incompatible with resident neighborhoods—resulted in the closure of hundreds of active oil wells, especially on LA's West Side.

Every Angeleno deserves to live in a safe and healthy neighborhood. Oil drilling operations are wholly incompatible with residential neighborhoods, and we urge swift completion of the legal and land use study. Further, upon timely completion of the study, we support the passage of a 2,500-foot setback ordinance to alleviate the symptoms and externalities that front-line communities experience daily.
