On behalf of the stakeholders in Region 1, the community of Sunland-Tujunga and in reaction to over 1000 petition signers throughout our local Foothill communities, the Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council requests that the Department of Transportation and all agencies related to traffic control in the City of Los Angeles, be notified to immediately remove the bollards and barriers starting at Foothill Boulevard by Sunland Park going west to Wentworth Street, with complete restoration of two lanes of traffic in either direction.

These recommendations come after experiencing the recent La Tuna Canyon firestorm which closed down the 210 Foothill Freeway at Sunland Boulevard for days and forced tens of thousands of motorists onto a single lane in either direction East & West on Foothill Boulevard while thousands of residents were fleeing their homes due to mandatory evacuations.

Based on the extreme difficulties caused by the reduction of lanes on our only main thoroughfare from the installation of seldom-utilized bike lanes; and taking into account the hours of delays and gridlock traffic caused by the lane reductions during this emergency disaster; and based on how these very concerns were expressed to our City officials and Department of Transportation reps when the lane reductions took place earlier this year – specifically, our concerns about how the single lanes would cause gridlock to motorists and impact our emergency services in a disaster; and based on the occurrences of at least three traffic accidents in this same area of Foothill Boulevard during the fire as motorists were trying to get out quickly we are requesting immediate action.

Nina Royal – Thanked community for participation in National Night Out, recognized band that played at event, thanked Herrold Egger and Little Landers Historical Society

Lisa Kincaid – has concerns with homeless population in area and drugs; had an incident two nights ago near her home; takes her child to Sunland Park Skate Park, homeless person tried to grab her son at park, neighbor was stabbed at park; concern is safety of community, can't go out at night or walk dog

Item 4 Comments from Public Officials

Officer Contreras – crime trends are flat in Sunland-Tujunga, addressed homelessness issues brought up during public comment; is having meetings with retail locations that may attract homeless customers; new council office has hired rapid response team

Question: why can't we have a law that says they have to do drug courses/classes? Answer: There was a law but more lenient sentencing laws don't encourage people to attend treatment

Question: How do we reach rapid response team? Answer: team is run through CD7 office; better to start with 311

Comment about HOPE teams available through LAPD

Question: what about mentally ill or threatening people encountered on street? Answer: Mentally ill by itself is not a crime, but if they are a danger to themselves or others, can be brought in for an evaluation

Question: People are living at Little Landers Park for several months. Answer: most parks in LA are like this, if they are not breaking laws they cannot be stopped

Question: how are La Crescenta and La Canada keeping homeless out. Answer: there are homeless everywhere, that is a misconception (maybe not at same level)

Question: if you ask someone at a park to move elsewhere, is it tracked, or are citations tracked? Answer: 2-3 years ago 20% of calls were homeless related, today, 90% of calls are homeless related

Question: level of violent crime is low compared to rest of city, has not encountered homeless persons in park in La Crescenta, but does not go to Sunland Park any more, what is difference between here and there? Answer: could be any of several reasons

William Pond (Field Rep for Assemblymember Bocanegra) – has recently taken over the ST and Lakeview Terrace areas

Eve Sinclair (Area Director for Councilwoman Monica Rodriguez) – reopened field office this month, office hours are M-F 9-5

Jared Degonia (Field Deputy for Supervisor Barger) – had a small community meeting recently with Supervisor on issues impacting city; LAPD and Foothill Division are primary law enforcement here, but encouraged NC to pay attention to what Sheriff is doing; Supervisor Barger is calling for formation of a commission to look into how county is implement AB109, Prop 47, and Prop 57; arrests are down after Prop 47 but enrollment in rehabilitation programs has also gone down

Question: if enrollment in mental health programs are down, are there vacancies now? Yes, in drug and alcohol programs, but not in overnight programs

County passed measure H and City passed measure HHH, County's role is the service component, anticipating \$360 million for services

Law enforcement can hold someone for 72 hours on a "5150" to determine if they are a risk, but criteria is openended; Supervisor wants to look at process to dig into mental health services with a focus on homelessness Question: After marijuana becoming legal, why not roll back Prop 47? Prop 47 was passed by referendum, and would need another referendum

Question: when organizing a homeless connect day, tried to contact some 501c3s but had trouble getting in touch with them, how will measure H be able to avoid non-profits taking advantage or not be accountable? Measure H will have accountability criteria

Vanessa Serrano (DONE rep)

September 9 Congress of Neighborhoods at City Hall

Have not heard back if elections will be held in 2018 or 2019

Asking NCs to keep all receipts from purchases and reimbursements

Department cannot give a computer to NC, but are available for use at DONE office

Kimberly Harris noted that CD7 office has brought together Forest Service, Fish and Wildlife, and other agencies Motion passes with 14 yes, 0 no, 0 abstentions

Comment: if 80% of 1000 wells are closed, isn't that in effect a taking of the rights of the well owners? Answer: NCSA is more concerned with health and safety of residents

Motion passes with 13 yes, 0 no, 0 abstain

Item 12: NPG for Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair for \$500

Krystee moves, Pati second

Krystee noted that event is held outside of NC boundaries

Mark Seigel noted that event is for all of Valley, not necessarily just the area where event is held, many NCs in north valley have an outreach booth, STNC has been invited to have one there

Pati said that we did not vote for it because it was far and STNC was low on funds last year

Amelia said she would be happy to write on it in her community article

Jon von Gunten noted that the request is for \$500 from a total \$29,000 budget

Pat Kramer did not think it was a good outreach event, most attendees were only looking for free items, and threw away any NC fliers or other NC items

Lydia Grant noted that over 26 NCs participated last year including some from south LA and the Harbor, could participate in other ways like putting logo on giveaway items or branded water bottles Motion does not pass 4 yes, 9 no
