GENERAL BOARD MEETING

Before the meeting is called to order DONE advisor Nyambura notes there is an I-pad in the back sign in area where those interested can leave their email if they wish to receive a Neighborhood Council Newsletter.

Item 1. Call to Order and Welcome—Meeting called to order, Pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call --Meeting quorum met. President Sanchez notes that some board members have been subjected to discrimination and sexism. She has brought this to BONC's attention. She denounces racism, sexism and ageism which discourage participation. All volunteers should be embraced and welcome. Secretary Cleghorn notes all board members present are up to date on their training.

Item 2. <u>Discussion / Possible Action to approve January 8th 2020 Board Meeting Minutes</u>

Motion approve January 8th 2020 Board Meeting Minutes

No roll call vote, no corrections noted or objections stated. 15 yes, Belt abstain, 2 absent, motion passed

<u>Item 3. STNC Board Updates / Announcement of Board Vacancies:</u> Secretary Cleghorn announces there are 2 vacancies for a Stakeholder Group Representative and one vacancy for Region 1 Representative. She reads the qualifications for both offices.

Item 4. General Community Event Announcements

Jina Maleksarkissians – The Foothill Retirement Community is having an open house in conjunction with the La Crescenta Chamber of Commerce on February 20th from 6 to 8pm, 6720 St. Estaban St. Tujunga. All are welcome.

Mark Dutton – Toastmasters is having a speech contest on February 17th at 6:30 pm with competition for the best international and comic speeches. There is also going to be an open house on February 24th.

Sheri Smith, Little Landers Historical Society / Bolton Hall: The second Saturday event for March will be Why is Hollywood Here? It will give a history of film making in Los Angeles. Bolton Hall will be changing its hours starting in April to be on Saturday and Sunday 1pm to 4 pm.

Michelle Ramage, Sunland/Tujunga/Shadow Hills Rotary the theme of this year's 4th of July Parade will be Our Children Our Future. There are parade applications in the front, all are welcome.

Michelle Ramage, Sunland/Tujunga/Shadow Hills Community Fund – The fireworks will need help with community support and sponsorships this year. The fund appreciates the STNC, but due to City rules the STNC will not be able to contribute funds to this event. The first fund raiser will be at Joselito's on February 26th.

Item 5. Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items:

Pat Kramer – Longtime community resident and volunteer John Yard passed away earlier this month. He was a statistician who was very helpful to the STAT committee in collecting data on traffic accidents in the area. He was also active in supporting conservation efforts.

Ivan Spiegel – Reminds everyone about the upcoming primary elections that will be using a different system with regional voting centers. The locations in our area are: Pinewood Elementary, Sunland Elementary, and the Sunland Senior Center. Voting starts on Saturday, February 29th. There will be same day registration and voting this election. There are also 11 day voting centers beginning February 22nd in La Crescenta and Burbank.

Claudia Akins – is embarrassed and ashamed that President Sanchez removed Ana Orudyan as Region 1 Representative for general board meeting absences that were due to the death of a family member. Representative Orudyan showed up at many neighborhood events.

<u>Item 6. Presentation & Q&A Update On Homeless Crisis – Caroline Menjivar, MSW, East Valley Rep for Mayor Garcetti</u>

To prevent homeless, there are new State and City programs underway: 1) Enforcing AB 1482 protects against rent gouging. This measure does not have guidelines, but they are working on this with the state. 2) The Solid Ground Program can assist families in getting up to 3 months financial assistance with rent and utilities, plus one year of wrap around services. 3) LA Enterprise helps people facing homelessness with skills and resources like business training, credit repair, and micro loans.

As for the homeless on the street, there have been 2,532 outreach contacts, 1,033 people placed in housing, 8,939 service calls and 3,353 clean ups. The Care Teams have gone from 5 day a week service to 7 days a week to keep up with illegal dumping. They have also modified their LAPD policy with law enforcement doing a pre-cleanup visit to camps with a history of negative interactions with clean-up crews.

There will be 26 Bridge Home projects completed by July. There are 519 beds now plus 439 on the way for a total of 958. There are no current Bridge Home projects in the valley but there will be two one in North Hollywood and one in Van Nuys. There is also a Navigation Center under construction in North Hollywood. There is going to be a woman's shelter in Sylmar and another shelter in Canoga Park. The last two projects are re-using existing buildings.

There are 150 Permanent Supportive Housing Projects underway that will produce 10,564 supportive units. In our area there will be projects in Lake View Terrance and Sun Valley. Los Angeles County also has projects underway. The state has promised more money and the Mayor has had discussions with Ben Carson at HUD principally about underused federal properties that might be used for homeless housing.

Q&A:

Q: Lydia Grant-- I attended another NC meeting in Wilmington where someone from a non-profit said they were given a \$300,000 grant from neighboring cities such as Hermosa Beach to put their homeless on the list to get supportive housing in LA. A: There is a coordinated entry system for supportive housing; it is not first come first serve. No one can pay to prioritize their clients. Still would be interested in details about what was said at this meeting. There is a problem with people from other areas including other states claiming to be local because many homeless do not have IDs.

Q: Cindy Cleghorn: regarding bridge housing, how much is the Mayor pushing those who do not want to be housed? A: There is a waiting list for the 14 bridge houses already in operation.

Q: Vicky Cerpa: What about people with mental health and drug problems? A: All these facilities have wrap around drug and mental health services. Residents are not forced into treatment.

Q: Pat Kramer: What date will the women's shelter in Sylmar open / what about the many homeless men in this area? A: The women's shelter should be done by late spring, no later than July. 90% of bridge housing is dedicated to men. Since there is no bridge housing in the ST area, the bridge housing will not be serving them. It was very difficult getting any bridge housing in the valley.

Q: Mark Dutton: Are existing structures being used for homeless housing? A: All the supportive housing projects are new from the ground up. The mayor's office has also done outreach with the neighbors of the proposed housing to address their concerns.

Item 14c. ST Traffic and Transportation Report – (item out of order) Pat Kramer—As a result of discussions with State Senator Portantino's office, the Senator is proposing a \$80,000 budget item to cover more traffic enforcement in Sunland Tujunga. The committee continues emailing the council office about more funding for traffic enforcement but they do not seem interested funding more enforcement in the area. Captain Nyman says there is more money available if approved. The LAPD has committed to doing educational 8

traffic safety talks at local schools. There will be an assembly at Mountain View Elementary this month. They are also working on getting slow down yard signs.

Item 7. Representative Announcements and Reports:

Arturo Garcia, Office of Assembly Member Luz Rivas 1) AB 1482 extends tenant protections. If you have an eviction problem that you believe may be unlawful, call the Alliance of Californians for Community Empowerment at 1 (888) 428-7615 2) Assemblywoman Rivas is working on a new parks bill AB 2031 to allow local agencies like schools to dedicate unused land for open space. 3) There will be an Earned Income Tax Credit Clinic on Feb 22nd at the PUC Inspire Charter School in Pacoima.

Jason Maruca, Field Deputy for LA County Supervisor Kathryn Barger – 1) Voting season is here, if you have any problems at a polling place call (818) 993-5170. 2) As for homeless issues the Supervisor co-authored a review of LAHSA (Los Angeles County Homeless Services Authority) to make sure it is meeting current needs. Supervisor Barger believes the priority should be immediate housing. 3) Regarding Camp Louis Roth, it is going to cost the County approx. \$300,000 to evaluate the property for mitigation. When President Sanchez asks if the land is going to be kept as open space she is told the County is still studying mitigation and what to do with the space. Stakeholder Mark Dutton: what is the status of the County purchasing the former St. Vincent's Hospital property in the Westlake area of Los Angeles for homeless housing? Jason Maruca confirms that the County is interested in buying this property for County services. Board Member von Gunten wonders if there is going to be any federal aid for homeless housing. Deputy Maruca thinks discussions with the federal government mostly focused on excess federal land.

Item 8. DONE Updates

Gibson Nyambura, DONE Advisor – 1) gives a brief presentation on the Data Hub / Geo Hub application as a resource for neighborhood councils to obtain demographic data, address lists, locate census kiosks, voting centers, 311 requests, community impact statements etc. etc. 2) In response to stakeholder inquires, notes Section 7 of the STNC Bylaws covers resignation by absence from general board meetings. At present the bylaws do not provide for excused absences. Board member Abramyan asks about accepting or rejecting a resignation, Advisor Nyambura responds this is up to the STNC president. Anyone who resigns from the STNC board can come back.



4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

The YMCA of the Foothills is currently providing three to four certified instructors to teach a once per week structured physical education class to approximately 1100 students who attend Mountain View and Sunland Elementary Schools. Besides the physical benefits of the program, students learn improved social and sportsmanship skills, nutrition and at home fitness programs for the whole family. The focus of the P.L.A.Y. program is to engage and create high levels of participation amongst the students, versus a focus on competition. We believe competition is still an important aspect of physical activity, and our coaches make sure that they create a safe environment for students to learn about the wide range of emotions that occur from success to defeat. The P.L.A.Y. Program was developed by the Kinesiology Department at California State University Northridge and aligns with the Physical Education Model Content Standards for California Public Schools. The Healthy Eating Physical Activity (H.E.P.A.) Standards created by the YMCA in a call to action by Michelle Obama, are also implemented in the P.L.A.Y. curriculum. The need for the P.L.A.Y. program was identified when formal physical education programs were cut from Los Angeles Unified School Districts schools several years ago due to on-going budget constraints. General study teachers were assigned to provide physical education to the students. Not only were they not certified to teach PE, the teachers lost a vital prep planning hour, critical to curriculum development and execution. The P.L.A.Y. 
According to the California Department of Education, 92% of Sunland's and Vinedale's students, 96% of Mountain View's students, and 67% of Stonehurst's students qualify for Federal reduced or free lunch - this is compared to 75% of kids district-wide, 66% county-wide and 58% statewide. Thus, these schools are comprised overwhelmingly of economically disadvantaged students. Numerous studies show that low income children and adults are far more likely to be overweight than those of greater means. As income falls, the rate of obesity rises. Obesity and lack of physical activity put these children at great risk of chronic diseases such as asthma, type 2 diabetes, colon cancer, heart disease and high blood pressure. In September of 2008, the Office of Health Assessment and Epidemiology (County of Los Angeles Public Health) published a Cities and Communities Health Report. In LA City Council District 2 (Sunland/Tujunga district), child obesity prevalence is reported at 22.5%. Our goal is to improve the health of these students and to start life-long habits of regular physical activity. We also expect these students to learn valuable life lessons of fair play and sportsmanship. All while learning about our Y's core values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility. Our coaches are expected to create a safe environment for students to discover, learn, and grow with physical activity being the backbone of their development. The students are able to find an activity that they like, and sometimes love, through the wide variety of the curriculum. Discovering their physical activity spark will in turn create a life-long healthy individual.

In an effort to curb this problem, the City has worked over recent years to implement the Vision Zero Initiative in order to make the City's streets safer for pedestrians, bicyclists and other motorists. The City has also completed speed surveys of City streets required to enforce speed limits, and allocated \$1.5 million in the 2019-20 Adopted Budget for enhanced enforcement by the Police Department in high-priority collision locations identified in the Vision Zero Initiative. Despite these steps, serious collisions remain a normal occurrence in the City, particularly in parts of the San Fernando Valley.

Often, fatal or serious vehicle collisions are the result of excessive speed or distracted driving, which puts everyone on the road at risk. Enforcement is a key component in reducing fatalities and injuries caused by speeding or distracted drivers. Data on enforcement efforts to date would ensure that the Council is able to make informed decisions on additional funding or resources for enforcement efforts in the future.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Police Department be directed to report on the status of its Vision Zero enforcement efforts, and on the use of Sworn Overtime allocated for this purpose in the 2019-20 Adopted Budget.

Sunland-Tujunga has had a significant increase in the number of Traffic collisions causing fatal and serious injuries. We are waiting for left-hand turn traffic signals at the sites where these accidents have occurred but it could take years for those installations to be completed. We need additional enforcement now so these unsafe traffic conditions do NOT continue. Foothill Blvd. is heavily travelled with more heavy trucks, speeding cars and cyclists on our streets.
