3. Pledge of Allegiance - led by President Grant

4. Presentations

a. Presentation by Kelly Gonez, LAUSD Board President

Kelly Gonez stated that all LAUSD students and teachers would have to test once a week before coming to school and that there was universal masking in and outdoors. She discussed the Superintendent search, stating that Humberto Carvalho had been selected and she discussed the 2022 art contest.

- Ronan Pestes stated that parents were not getting their questions answered by school board members.
- A stakeholder asked why PCR tests were being used. Ms. Gonez stated that LAUSD followed guidelines from public health authorities.
- Ms. Schmidt asked about students being vaccinated without parental consent, stated her opposition to vaccine mandates, and asked about critical race theory (CRT) being taught at LAUSD schools. Ms. Gonez stated that parental consent was required and that CRT was not a pedagogy at K-12 schools.
- Ms. Cleghorn asked about students not being able to take tests. Ms. Gonez stated that if tests had been done outside of LAUSD it had sometimes led to technical issues.
- Mr. Schmidt asked if informed consent was required for vaccine mandates. Ms. Gonez stated that
 informed consent was required for all students under 18 years of age and that she supported vaccine
 mandates for school personnel.
- Chairwoman Grant stated that LAUSD had not provided an antigen test when she had requested one.
 Ms. Gonez stated that there had been supply problems with antigen tests.

b. **Certificate to Matt Walker** - Ms. Schmidt introduced the item, reading the certificate and describing his clean-up work.

5. Comments by Elected Officials/Representatives, DONE, City Departments

LAPD Captain Johnny Smith spoke about an incident involving a plane that had crash landed on train tracks and a rescue of the people on board by Sgt. Joseph Cavestany, Officers Christopher Aboyte, Damien Castro, and Robert Sherock. **Officer Christopher Aboyte** described the incident from his point of view, stating that he and his fellow officers pulled the pilot out of the plane before a train collided with it.

Captain Smith stated that Foothill officers had confiscated more illegal firearms than any other division in the department. He stated that SLOs Caloca and Contreras would likely be moved out of the division.

LAPD Senior Lead Officer (SLO) Contreras stated that the move was unexpected and that he was proud of the work he did in the area. Chairwoman Grant and Captain Smith thanked SLO Contreras for his service to the community.

Mark Ross, Neighborhood Prosecutor from the City Attorney's office, spoke about a transient who had repeatedly trespassed in the area and several RVs that may be tapping into the City streetlights. He gave his email as mark.ross@lacity.org.

Declan Floyd stated that Sen. Portantino stated that the Senator had written an education bill.

Jason Maruca, from Supervisor Kathryn Barger's office stated that the Supervisor had caught COVID-19 and that it appears that many positive COVID tests at hospitals were performed on patients admitted for other ailments. He stated that Sunland-Tujunga will remain in the 5th District and that the Supervisor agreed with Ms. Cleghorn that illegal testing sites needed to be addressed.

Michelle Vergara, East Valley Area Rep. from the Mayor's office, stated that the City had transferred all of its testing sites to the County. She stated that there were 13 testing sites at which residents could take home free tests and that Metro seven, fifteen, and thirty day passes would be half price. She stated that the homeless count would be January 25th, 8-11 PM in the area and that six out of a possible 80 volunteers had registered. [Note date changed to Feb. 22]

Eve Sinclair from Councilwoman Rodriguez office stated that North Valley City Hall and Hansen Dam have COVID testing sites and that two speed feedback signs had been placed on Foothill Blvd. She gave updates on increased street lighting, RV parking restrictions, and that there had been a clean up on Commerce.

Vanessa Serrano, from DONE, discussed upcoming funding training and workshops. She stated that a workshop would be held on January 20th from 6 - 7:30 PM. She stated that DONE had released a post-election outreach report and that DONE had hired new neighborhood advocates.
