FY 2025-26 Canva Pro License Renewal, May 15, 2025: As you may know, EmpowerLA has been supplying Neighborhood Councils with one (1) Canva Pro license under the EmpowerLA team account. This license allows Neighborhood Councils to access branded templates and designs to support Neighborhood Council outreach with flyers, social media, and email graphics, and more. In light of the ongoing financial challenges the City of Los Angeles is facing, beginning in Fiscal Year 2025-26, **Neighborhood Councils will be required to opt into their Canva Pro license and be invoiced for the license(s) they wish to purchase. Each Canva Pro license will cost approximately \$100. By purchasing Canva Pro licenses through EmpowerLA, Neighborhood Councils will continue to have access to the suite of branded templates and designs created and shared by the EmpowerLA staff. Neighborhood Councils who wish to renew their Canva Pro license with EmpowerLA must notify us no later than Thursday, May 15, 2025**. As with any financial expenditure, Neighborhood Councils who wish to purchase a Canva Pro license(s) must agendize the expenditure, vote, and approve the motion at a board meeting. Conflict of Interest Announcement

Any Board Member who may have a conflict of interest and you have not consulted with the Office of the City Attorney, the Board should move to have the matter tabled until the next meeting so that the Board member has an opportunity to consult with the City Attorney's Office. If the Board declines to table the matter, the Board Member may want to consider recusal before the matter is discussed. If choosing to recuse, the Board Member should state for the record all reasons for the recusal and that they will be leaving the meeting during the discussion and voting. Because recusal may not always be sufficient, tabling of the matter at issue is always preferred to allow time for the Board Member to consult with the City Attorney's Office.

Neighborhood Council Distribution Groups

On October 15, 2024, EmpowerLA launched the Neighborhood Council Distribution Groups for each of the 99 Neighborhood Councils in the City of Los Angeles. This project, which was accomplished in collaboration with the Information Technology Agency (ITA), is the result of an extensive effort to establish a streamlined, secure, and efficient method for communication with the Neighborhood Councils, and replaces the Neighborhood Councils' forwarding email addresses that were previously used. Google distribution groups are email lists that allow users to send an email to multiple recipients using a single email address. These groups are typically used to facilitate communication.

EmpowerLA sent an invitation to the executive board members of each Neighborhood Council with instructions on how to access the NC Distribution Groups. Access to use these distribution groups has been provided to executive board members by default. Neighborhood Council boards may elect to provide a more specific list of designated users by contacting the Department at <u>communications@EmpowerLA.org</u>. Changes to the designated senders will be managed by EmpowerLA Administrative staff. - We received 1,522 candidate applications this election, an increase of 217 from the 2023 election cycle.
- As of this past Friday, we have received 11,786 voter registration applications, an increase of 6,872 from 2023, and 4,992 ballots, an increase of 2,441 from 2023.

Zoom Updates

This is a friendly reminder to take action on renewing your Zoom licenses for the 2025-2026 year. The renewal period runs from April 1, 2025, through March 31, 2026.

To complete your renewal, please follow these steps:

- 1. **Board Approval**: Conduct a board action to approve the Zoom license renewal for the upcoming year, including the account and account holder.
- 2. **Notify Your NEA**: Ensure your Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate (NEA) is informed of the board's action.

NCs should have this completed by March 20, 2025. Once these steps are completed, the Department will issue an invoice for the estimated amount of \$200.00 per Zoom account for the year. The approved amount will be deducted accordingly. We strongly recommend assessing your

board's Zoom usage before making any decisions regarding license reductions to avoid unnecessary costs. If you have any questions or need assistance, please feel free to reach out.

Congress of Neighborhoods

The <u>workshop application</u> for the 2025 Congress is now open. Applications received after May 1 may not be reviewed. SB 1174 Update

Senate Bill 1174, signed by Governor Newsom and effective January 1, prohibits local governments from requiring identification for voting or ballot submission, enforceable only if mandated by state or federal law. However, this law does not apply to the registration process. In Neighborhood Council Elections, stakeholders are still required to provide documentation, including identification, for registration purposes. If your board would like more information, your board president can contact NCAD.

AB467 and SB707

The Department is collaborating with Assembly Member Mike Fong's office on AB 467 to extend teleconferencing provisions for an additional five years. With SB 411 set to expire on January 1, 2026, the Department is actively working to secure its extension. If passed, this bill would allow neighborhood city councils to continue using alternative teleconferencing provisions until January 1, 2031. The bill has been assigned to the Committee on Local Government, and we are currently working to build support from the council office to advance it to the Governor's desk.

SB 707 was also introduced by Senator Maria Elena Durazo, which proposes a similar extension of the teleconferencing provision until January 1, 2031. The bill expands to county and city governments. We are scheduled to discuss with her office the details of the bill. To get more input from the community, there is a survey being conducted by the senator's office on this bill.
