6. **DISCUSSION/ACTION:**
  - a) **Land Use update re: SB79 - Council File # 25-1803** - City Planning Commission hearing held 5-14-26 and next goes to City Council (PLUM) - Commission approved the draft recommendation for the Low Rise Ordinance. They also approved 3 technical modifications which were last minute additions made by Planning. Exhibit 2B that added more density than Planning recommended was not supported by the Commission but will go to the City Council for consideration. Technical modifications: Approved by Commission. Cindy went over the information in this item. There were no additional comments.

1. Rear yard setbacks were changed from 4 ft rear to 8 ft. *Better than 4 but not what we wanted.*
2. A 15 ft rear yard setback could be offered as an incentive to meet the open space requirement. We had suggested this to Planning last week as a way to make a 15 ft rear yard setback attractive to developers. Developers are required to offer open space for these projects. Rooftop use as open space is often a way developers meet that requirement. However, because rooftops are expensive to make available for this use, most developers don't like doing them. Offering open space credit for a 15 ft setback seemed like a good way to get this setback from developers. Planning agreed. This is voluntary but an attractive offer none the less. *We thank Planning for agreeing to add this modification.*
3. Balconies could extend out to 5 ft in the front facade of the developments. It was clarified today that any changes to SB 79 will impact this ordinance in the same way. *Reassuring!* By mail notification was determined to be too expensive so it is currently not being considered! *Ridiculous!* We need to keep pushing as this goes to the City Council and PLUM (Planning and Land Use committee).

**7. DISCUSSION/ACTION** New Land Use Projects:

- a) 11162 Langmuir - DIR-2026-1982-SPPC filed 4/26/226 - New single family residence – Scenic Corridor Specific Plan. Jonathan Sigherian represented the project and discussed it; he is with VK Engineering, 2529 Foothill Blvd, Suite 206, La Crescenta. The owners are Andrew Hall and Breanna Johnson, also present at the meeting. Jonathan is a structural engineer; the designer is PHMI. This company essentially provides the blueprints and construction materials which have already been pre-cut for the particular house. Comments were made by Cindy, David, Barry and Michelle. Jonathan explained the project in detail, with information including earthquake fault lines, building location specifics, cutting into the hillside, cypress trees removal, water drainage plans, debris/dirt removal during construction, fire considerations in the build of the house, catchment for rainfall, driveways, geological report, and neighbor awareness of the project. There is no hearing date set yet. There was some confusion about the address; no case number is assigned yet. Cindy said project has a DR number (# 2026-1982-SPPC). Jonathan inquired about whether the LUC could give a recommendation about the project; Cindy said it would go to the full STNC Board. Neighbor awareness and understanding their concerns (if any) is important, perhaps with letters of support (or non-support) from the neighbors; Cindy would like to invite them to a future meeting to discuss the project. June 10<sup>th</sup> is the next planned meeting which will be in-person at the Elk's Lodge. All planning is per City code. Michelle can send the full report to Cindy.
  - a) **10425 McVine** - DIR-2026-1769 filed 4/9/26 - Lot Line Adjustments - New Duplex - Foothill Blvd. Corridor Specific Plan. Cindy noted that there was no one representing this project at the meeting to discuss it and it will be continued. *It is noted from Google that currently there is a 5 single-story units (four 2-bed/1-bath, one 1-bed/1-bath) spanning a combined 4,393 sq. ft. and because of the LAR3 zoning and lot size, developers can construct a new 23-unit complex by right, or up to 35 units if utilizing density bonuses.*
