1. **CALL TO ORDER** - Lydia Grant, President, 6:45p,
 - a. **3,800 sq. ft ADU – Updates.** Lydia described a bill where ADUs are allowed to be built along the line of 400 and 800 sq ft units. Due to some wording that could be interpretive, developers are building ADUs considerably larger, with one developer in Sherwood Forest building three that are 3,800 sq ft each and on a single property, renting them out for around \$55,000/month. This totally defeats the purpose of the original bill. ST is a high fire zone and we need to be vigilant about excessive developments. There is a program in process that will help determine evacuation time predictions that will be helpful.
 - b. **Dam Dredging Updates** - For more information about the mitigation area, please visit: www.dpw.lacounty.gov/wrd/Projects/BTWMA. The original concern was that the City planned to dredge two dams at the same time which could impact the ability to withdraw water for fire suppression in the event of a fire. Lydia said that she has now heard that one of the dams was not a dam where water was planned to be taken; she is talking to Ricardo Flores and will pursue it to confirm this is the case and find out where the water resource tanks/dams are located.

4. DISCUSSION//Updates/Q&A:

- a. LAPD, LAFD, Elected Officials/Representatives (Mayor, CD7, State Assembly, LAUSD, DONE, Budget Advocates, City Departments, LADWP)
 - i. **Officer Coloca.** Officer Coloca provided crime stats, with comparisons for a year ago. Crime stats, have gone down, comparing to a year ago.
 - ii. **Officer Godoy.** Officer Godoy provided crime stats, with comparisons for a year ago. Godoy noted that there was a case where a vehicle was broken into and the thief took keys and registration, etc. in the glove compartment. The owner didn't change the codes and later the garage was broken into.
 - iii. **LAFD Fire Battalion Chief John Ignatczyk** talked about a recent brush fire and 4th of July safety, noting that fireworks are illegal. The Bomb squad responds for explosive fireworks. Other issues are illegal storage. The Chief talked about fire safety and weather/wind conditions, how to watch for information (i.e. WatchDuty and the City website <https://lacounty.gov/emergency/> or <https://lafd.org/alerts>), reporting brush fires, weather/wind condition awareness, heat wave power outages, and powering devices with lithium ion batteries where, if the batteries are not charged properly, thermal runaway could occur and even fires/explosions. Cheryl asked about where super scooters got their water supply and Jon asked about arsonists.
 - iv. **Ricardo Flores**, Senior Area Rep for M Rodriguez. Ricardo discussed upcoming events in the community and surrounding communities. Cheryl asked about the 4th of July parade. Nina asked about street closure for National Night Out (NNO). Cindy asked about cleans street crews and scheduling and the Oro Vista project and a project at the intersection of Tujunga Cyn and Commerce Ave.
 - v. **Alex Avanesyan**, Field Representative at California State Assembly. Alex discussed bills and addressed questions from Lydia.
 - vi. **Andres Garcia**, representing Senator Caroline Minjivar. Andres discussed current bills including one that deals with reckless driving after a question from MC Pat Kramer. Menjivar hopes to support the 4th of Juy parade in ST.
 - vii. **Jose Galdamez**, *Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate (NEA) with EmpowerLA*. Jose discussed future deadlines and events including budget and fiscal year end dates noting that July 1st is first day of the fiscal year. Fiscal training is being offered through courses on Youtube, which can be taken now. Lydia asked about keeping the training table in the Empower website up to date (<https://neighborhoodempowerment.lacity.gov/stnc/>)

- viii. **Pat Kramer**, STNC STAT Chair. The Traffic Town Hall, held just before the General Board meeting at the Elk's, was very successful, with 35 stake-holders and numerous LAPD and Traffic Reps in attendance. Discussed were unsafe driving, speeding, road take-overs, and more. There were a lot of good questions and had to be cut off at 2 hours. Pat would like to see these meetings every 6 months.
- ix. **Lydia Grant**. Lydia provided an update on the 4th of July Parade. Earlier this year it was decided by someone in the City that this event would not be funded, starting with this year – the 250th anniversary. The parade has been going on in ST for 50 years. The Rotary Club has been pivotal in getting the permits and leading the effort. At this time the City has re-decided and is going to pay some subsidies for the parade. STNC has committed money to the parade (or parade events) of \$3,000 and \$300 towards a float for STNC. Lydia noted that there was a news article in the NY Post and when people became aware that the parade was cancelled, began to donate money. One news article made it's way to Australia with many views (52K). Ricardo said Rodriguez was going to donate \$5K and get the DOT to waive its' \$5K fee. With some consideration by the City, and donations, the parade is planned to go forward. Extra donations, if any, can be put towards the parade next year. 6. **DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION regarding Council File 26-0600** with reference to Animal Food, Spay/Neuter and dogs playing for life budget allocations. Council File 26-0600 is the official Los Angeles City budget proposal for the 2026-27 fiscal year. Lydia explained that the proposed budget eliminated the dedicated General Fund allocation for animal food, and severely reduced medical supplies. Animal advocates and rescue organizations raised serious alarms about not providing or reducing food budgets, warning that city shelters would be forced to rely almost entirely on private donations and the Animal Welfare Trust Fund just to feed animals in their care. Motion made to approve disapproving Council File **26-0600** provision that eliminates a dedicated line item for animal food and sharply reduced medical supplies.

Lydia recounted some history about testing in the past where STNC results, when tested, showed toxic materials but County testing did not. The City and County have not been forth-coming with testing results and while the issue is not forgotten, it is not clear what else STNC can do. Karen von Gunten, MC impacted by proximity to the dump, said that there is dirt piles are currently being graded by bull-dozer, disrupting the current toxic dirt and potentially spreading the toxins if there is a wind event. The City was supposed to have put clean dirt over the toxic dirt; proof that this has occurred is likely not possible to do.
