FREE SERVICES AVAILABLE FOR WILDFIRE RECOVERY

FAMILY SERVICES

- Assess for emergency shelter and rental assistance
- Assist in screening and applying for income support programs
- Food, transportation, and other basic needs
- Assist with filing taxes and claiming up to \$10,000 in tax credits
- Referrals to immigration services

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

- \$2,000 in cash assistance for impacted workers
- Assist with disaster unemployment claims (for workers and contractors)
- Job placement and job training
- Offer supportive services, such as clothing, union dues, and transportation
- Access to temporary employment at \$25-\$27 per hour for 600 hours

YOUTH SERVICES

- Help applying for part-time jobs
- Youth educational services
- Guidance in accessing mental health resources
- Support in finding after-school activities

SMALL BUSINESS SERVICES

- Bilingual assistance for business permits
- Financial advice for recovery
- Business management and growth workshops
- Grants available from \$2,000 to \$25,000
