Julia Stein's seventh book of poetry, *What Were They Like?* was published March 2013. In the last two years she edited two books of poetry: *Every Day is an Act of Resistance: Selected Poems of Carol Tarlen* by the brilliant S.F. poet Carol Tarlen who died in 2004 and *Walking Through a River of Fire: 100 Years of Triangle fire Poetry.* Stein is the 2011 Joe Hill Poetry Award winner. **Julia has worked on an oral history project interviewing pioneers of the San Fernando Valley including children who grew up in Sunland-Tujunga to pioneer families 1900-1920.**

Excerpt from Julia's poem, *AFTER THE FIRE STORM* -

*"We walked up to the stone ruins of the stagecoach house,  
saw blackened weeds in the middle of stone cisterns,  
started hiking up the brown-stone devil's slide where  
once a stagecoach route cut across the hills; now  
we can learn to find the path through the stony land.*

*We saw against the black ash a green weed  
with stinking yellow lemon gourds--the calabash.  
Yes, we need to be green weeds and lemon gourds  
stinking up the blackness of this city, saying we can  
grow again, making this city a good green place."*
